Individual Parent Comments on Areas of improvement for the school	School response/
Homework needs to be reviewed, no one wants to spend their weekends doing it, given out on a Monday and back on a Friday would give four evenings rather than rushing to get it in by Wednesday.	Your comment is appreciated; it is always difficult to accommodate everyone. Many parents in the past have asked for homework to be sent at the weekend as that is when they have time to do it.
- I am really disappointed how the school have handled the year 6 leavers. I appreciate the difficulties around COVID but other schools have managed making events for the kids.	I understand your disappointment at not being involved as a parent. Several in-school events took place and the leavers assembly was recorded and put on the website. The local authority advised maintained schools to continue with the existing COVID protocol until the end of term.
- The leavers hoodies still haven't been received as they were ordered so late and the approach since May half term is to wind down the learning after so much school time has been missed. I haven't reflected this dissatisfaction in my answers as it is purely this half term. - Although I have answered yes to the above questions, I have been very disappointed over the last term. I know you are restricted in what you can do due to COVID, but I feel much more could have been done for the year 6 who finish primary school this Summer. They have missed out on so much school over the last two years but have spent the last three weeks helping teachers get ready for the new term in September. I would have expected them to be doing work right up to the end of term to try and catch up on what they have missed while schools were closed. There are also missed messages for the children at times. One of my children was told they were unable to bring a reading book from home and had to choose a school book but then a couple of weeks later children are allowed to bring fidget toys to play with...why a toy but not a reading book?	- Hoodies were in school in time for the children to wear before they left. - The recovery curriculum focussed on Mental Health, Wellbeing, and Physical activity alongside the formal curriculum - Please, in future if you feel there are mixed messages please could you communicate this with the senior leadership team.
More support instead of constantly issuing warnings. I understand there is a need for rules but at times it is so negative.	The school's restorative practice regarding behaviour offers children the opportunity to reflect on their behaviour and make a more positive choice.
The lollipop lady needs to start earlier.	I will pass this onto Lincolnshire County Council as the lollipop lady is employed by them directly.
